No.22 平和への願い-久留米の戦争遺跡(1) War Remains 1

World War II ended in 1945. The number of people who have experienced it is decreasing every year. In the future, the war remains will come to take an important role in handing down its memories. So, it is necessary to investigate and preserve them to show the reality of the war to the younger generation.

"War Remains" are buildings, architectural structures or traces which are related to the war, both within and outside modern Japan. In Kurume, the site of the 48th Infantry Regiment was established in 1897. Subsequently, other military facilities such as division headquarters, regimental headquarters, hospital, fort, and maneuvering ground were built across the city. Then, the city was called a Military Town. Today we have those remains and traces, which include the severe damages caused by the US air force in August 1945.




Source about the square measures of each facility:

Around Nishitetsu Kurume Station (Fig. 1, 2 and Table 1)

The military facilities of the former Japanese Army used to exist around the current location of the Revenue Office —in its premise, there are still the brick mortar walls, the gate pillar, and a boundary marker inscribed with "Army".

Besides, the building of the Division Commander Residence is currently reused as a center for culture and education.

In Mii and Nonaka Towns (Fig. 1, 3 and Table 1)

There are the former military sites that were ceded to Kurume University, National Agricultural Research Center for Kyushu Okinawa Region, Kurume Bicycle Race Track, etc.

The grounds of the Race Track used to be the army cemetery. There are still a cenotaph, an Army Bridge, a tower to bow toward the Imperial Court in Tokyo (*yohai to*), and an amphitheater.



In Kokubu and Korauchi Towns (Fig. 1, 4 and Table 1)

Here, it is the first area in which a military base was placed. Some parts of the land are now used for a school and other purposes, while there are still military facilities such as Japan Ground Self-Defense Force, the 4th Artillery Regiment, and the Officer Candidate School. It is possible to visit their museum, which is located in an old building built in 1897 (reservation required).

In Minami Town (Fig. 1, 5 and Table 1)

This area was converted into schools and residential quarters. The street runs along the northern side of schools, which are located side by side, and then it is called School Street. But before World War II, it used to be a military road.
